University of California Humanities Research and Scholarship Opportunities

Humanities research is critical to understanding ourselves. Federal funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) allows scholars to gain new insights as we imagine the future. Since its creation more than 50 years ago, the NEH provides support that leverages critical additional funding from states, philanthropists, industry and foundations. UC scholars and researchers compete for NEH funds, which they use to strengthen teaching and learning; create new knowledge through extensive, in-depth study; preserve and protect cultural and educational treasures; and, benefit students and people in local communities through projects with museums, libraries, local schools, other colleges, public television and radio. Many of these projects produce information and materials that provide access to cultural and educational resources and opportunities for lifelong learning that would otherwise not be available in some areas. The impact of the humanities goes beyond UC campuses to local communities—and through research and scholarship—beyond.
